During the school year the youths' math, reading/English, vocational training, and tutoring (one period each) are part of their regular school day program. WIA supplements the youths' school program with work readiness training and work experience opportunities. Youth will be placed in subsidized, unsubsidized, or volunteer work at least 15 hours per week, receiving extensive job coaching and support. During the summer, the youth participate in a special summer component of the program that combines classroom activities (basic skills work, work readiness skills) and work activities on Belvidere School District properties and other sites. During the work component of the program, the youth work in teams, under the close supervision of program staff, performing project-based activities.</p>

Boone/Winnebago WIA monies contribute toward the funding of 30 youth in the <i>YouthBuild Rockford's</i> program cycle that begins in fall 2007 and ends in July 2008. WIA youth who do not earn a credential and enter further training and/or employment will remain in the program in PY 2008 to complete their GED and then enter further training and/or employment. The program provides academic instruction to help dropout youth earn a GED. The program gives youth the opportunity to gain essential workplace skills (good attendance, punctuality, interest in work, completing tasks, specific occupational skills, etc.) through extensive classroom and hands-on occupational skills instruction in the construction or computers. (Some youth in construction skills may be able to earn a nationally recognized credential from the National Center for Construction Education and Research.)</p>

During the school year, the educational program (funded by non-WIA sources) includes tutoring, study skills training/strategies, and group and individual instruction in course work leading to secondary school completion. The WIA-funded component of the program (a daily class) helps youth develop the basic employment skills and competencies needed to succeed in the workplace. The youth also receive supplemental tutoring in their school subjects to help them succeed in the program. In July 2007 and June 2008, RLC conducts a special three-week special summer component of the program. Academics, computer skills, and career exploration are emphasized. The program has both Rockford and Belvidere sites.</p>

In order to accomplish these goals, students are placed in a class that meets four days per week, three hours per day, twelve hours per week on a continuous basis for up to two years until they accomplish their goals. The class provides instruction in GED test areas, career exploration, and work readiness skills. Volunteer tutors may provide individualized tutoring and support for program participants; students may also use the RVC Success Center's tutoring services. Staff assist participants secure job shadowing experiences, internships, and jobs and/or apply for further education/training. The program provides on-going guidance and counseling/case management and job development. The program is housed at the RVC Stenstrom Center and serves youth from both Winnebago and Boone counties.</p>

During the school year, the program meets at Guilford after school for two hours twice weekly; at this time, the program tutors provides individualized tutoring in specific problem areas identified by the school's bi-lingual staff or other teachers with whom the tutors consult. During the summer, youth may attend special programming conducted by the Rockford School District; if most program youth are attending summer school, WIA program staff will assist at the school. After the summer school program ends, WIA youth will meet for three hours once weekly at the Workforce Connection to receive basic skills remediation/enhancement tutoring and work readiness/career exploration activities. Youth may participate in job shadowing activities, internships, and subsidized or unsubsidized work experiences (school year and summer). Counseling/mentoring activities will be provided on an on-going basis.</p>

The school year the program meets at each site (school) twice weekly and sessions with all students from all sites are held Saturday mornings. Other activities also take place during the month. During the summer participants attend daily enrichment classes in math, English, science, social studies and work readiness. In addition, students have opportunities to participate in "Career Camps," Work Study/Job Shadowing Internships, and a high adventure leadership retreat; some students may participate in a week-long college tour. The program provides year-round programming emphasizing secondary school completion or GED attainment, followed by additional training and/or job placement. The program may refer those who have not completed high school to Roosevelt Alternative High School, the Regional Learning Center, or RVC Adult Education GED classes; MELD also provides individual and small group tutoring and counseling to help the youth complete high school or attain a GED. Program staff conduct work-readiness skills workshops for WIA youth. Staff also work individually with youth to help them enter advanced training and/or secure employment after earning a GED/completing school. (Some youth will also be employed while they are completing school/GED.) WIA-subsidized work experience may be used to help youth gain employment experience. MELD conducts parenting support groups for the youth and provides intensive on-going counseling and mentoring.</p>

The program provides vocational instruction (another funding source), work readiness skills training, and intensive placement assistance, focusing on extensive job coaching. While in the program, the youth may enter subsidized or unsubsidized work experiences with employers. Historically, many employers hire youth outright. Youth are coached by job coaches during their initial months on the job. Program runs year-round, with the summer component including tutoring, mentoring, counseling and/or job placement follow-up. Youth who enter the program in their junior year will be in the program two years.</p>
